Guidelines for Entrance in the Certificate III in Health Service Assistance (Operating Theatre Technician Work) HLT32507

This sample guide is provided to prospective students of the Mayfield Education Operating Theatre Technician course.

Entrance Criteria for the course is a pass mark of 60% in the following three areas.

- Literacy
- Numeracy
- Language

The test is one hour duration and you must obtain 60% pass rate in **each** section.

The test is made up of multiple choice questions, vocabulary, comprehension of the written word and numeracy.

During the actual test, dictionaries, calculators or any other type of electronic assistance is not permitted.

- Correct spelling and punctuation
- Grammar and sentence formation
- Vocabulary
- Logical flow of ideas
- Legibility of handwriting
